Project Employment Connect Works to Build Employment in Missoula Event Set for Friday, Sept. 20

The Missoula At-Risk Housing Coalition and its partners invite all citizens who are unemployed or underemployed to participate in the second Project Employment Connect event on Friday, Sept. 20, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The event is free of charge and requires no appointment. It will focus on building and strengthening employment in the Missoula area by offering hands-on help. The event will be held at two locations this year. Participants can start at Salvation Army at 355 S. Russell St. and receive reading glasses, haircuts, professional resume photographs and interview clothing and then take a shuttle to the Lifelong Learning Center at 310 S. Curtis St. to receive more services: education about job training programs; help from programs for veterans, youth and young mothers; birth certificate and identification assistance; resume support and interview tips; and community resource information.
