The grant will enhance five new traffic calming circles by installing planters. Establish 2 parklets each with a bench. Planting trees, shrubs, bunch grasses and flowering plants on the Greenways. 2021	Grant Creek Traffic Signal Box Art	Grant Creek	During the summer and fall of 2020, the Montana Department of Transportation maintained North Reserve Street, replacing four of the beautified signal boxes and adding a new signal box at the intersection of I-90 and Grant Creek Road. The Public Art Committee has a long-term agreement with the Montana Department of Transportation (DOT) under which almost 70 signal boxes in Missoula have been beautified. That agreement provides that if the DOT replaces a beautified signal box, the old signal box is disposed of and a new stainless steel box takes its place. Vinyl-wrapped signal boxes are easier to re-beautify because the original computer file can be used to print another vinyl wrap. Re-beautifying painted signal boxes requires starting from scratch. The Traffic Signal Box project has been a Missoula success from 2009 to the present, connecting Missoula through art on its streets. Every neighborhood has the opportunity to have their traffic boxes transformed. Nearly 70 signal boxes located throughout the Missoula urban area have been transformed into works of art. In keeping with the park restrictions to use only natural materials the classroom shall be constructed of locally sourced natural stone seating benches arranged in a classic amphitheater design and set on a gravel pad. Appropriate complimentary landscaping consisting of native trees, plants and gravel pathways connecting the new feature to the existing trail system will be included. The Leveling Project will eliminate the low spots on the ground that allow water to pool on the surface of the ice. Pooling water takes longer to freeze, and on warm days and during winter rain events, causes the ice to melt. 2021	Paxson PTA	University District	The Play! Paxson Project is intended to improve the playground and open space at the K-5 Paxson Elementary School. The current playground is approximately 15 years old and does not provide adequate engagement for the wide age range of kids attending Paxson Elementary. In addition, the open space play field is frequently unavailable to the kids due to mud and degradation of the grassy surface. Safety concerns and safe routes to school initiated the need for this playground improvement project. A team of concerned parents approached the City of Missoula to address multiple safety concerns.
